1. Looking for Marie Wegelin

The Ottawa Police Service is seeking public assistance in locating a missing elderly female. She was last seen in the early afternoon hours of April 29th, 2018 in the 2300 block of Carling Avenue. Police were later called when she could not be located.

Marie Wegelin, 80 years old, is described as a white female, 5'6 (168cm), 100 lbs (45kg) with shoulder length dyed brown hair. She was last seen wearing a grey pant suit with a white shirt and carrying a black purse. She has some difficulty walking. (see attached photos)
