
Please be mindful the event is weather-dependent, as freezing rain (in particular) has led to the cancellation in previous years.

changes — from the province and city — that may affect every street in Champlain Park.

The association also takes this moment to send an advance signal the **board is looking for a new secretary.** This is an important position that helps fulfill the association's legal requirements to the province as a corporate non-profit. It's a great way to contribute to our neighbourhood, connect with neighbours and, who knows, have a little fun!

The primary responsibilities are to set meeting dates, organize agendas, write minutes (brief, decisionbased), file meeting records on Google Drive for virtual board meetings (about eight per year) and the AGM and, once a year, report an updated list of


directors to the province. The other board members are there to help!
